Information about the project

The project "Empowering Albanian Resilience co-implementing a Multi-Hazard Early Warning System Nationwide (EAR -MHEWS)" is implemented by NCPA, and their national partners will put in place a fit-for purpose MHEWS that addresses, for the first time, multiple climate hazards in a structured, coordinated and 'joined up' manner. The geographical scope of the MHEWS will be national, although, of course, individual hazard-related needs will be geographically differentiated: for instance, flooding is particularly prominent in flood-prone areas of the coastal belt. This project is an integral part of the Green Climate Fund (GCF) co-financed programme "Climate Services for a Resilient Albania" – ALBAdapt, implemented by GIZ.

Local Technical Coordinator Shkodra / Fier

The Local Coordinator (s) plays a vital role in managing and facilitating this program at a local/regional level. The Local Technical Coordinator of the project focuses on coordinating the technical aspects of the Project, to be carried out in the Shkodra / Fier region to ensure that project activities are implemented appropriately at the local level and in line with the project objectives and the appropriate engagement of stakeholders and local communities.

Job Description:

- Project coordination, implementation and monitoring of the early warning system at the local level, ensuring that they are accessible and functional within the community.
- Daily communication and coordination with stakeholders in the field.
- Close coordination and communication with the Project Officer and the Technical Officer.
- Provide technical support for disaster risk reduction activities, including risk assessments and community-based planning.
- Work with local authorities, stakeholders and community groups to raise awareness and build capacity in disaster preparedness and response.
- Collaborate with the project team to integrate the disaster risk reduction strategy into community development plans and project activities.
- Facilitate training and capacity building workshops on disaster risk management, early warning system and preparedness planning for local stakeholders.
- Support the development of school emergency response plans and ensure that early warning protocols are integrated within these plans.

- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the early warning system, providing regular updates and recommendations for improvement.
- Act as a liaison between local communities and the wider project team, ensuring that community needs and concerns are addressed in project planning and execution.
- Coordinate the collection, analysis and dissemination of disaster-related data, including early warning alerts and risk assessments.
- Advocate for and support local communities in implementing resilience and disaster preparedness activities, with an emphasis on gender and vulnerability-sensitive approaches.
- Support the implementation and documentation of interventions in line with the Gender Action Plan and the Environmental and Social Action Plan.

Key Skills:

- Strong knowledge of organizing, networking and development activities.
- Scheduling and event planning, building and maintaining local partnerships
- Ability to track progress and produce reports for donors or management.
- Ability to adapt to unforeseen changes or emergencies.
- Strong coordination skills and providing accurate information to different range of stakeholders (local authorities, NGOs, beneficiaries, national and international).
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills in Albanian and English.

Required qualifications, competences and experience:

- Bachelor's degree in a relevant field (e.g., Development Studies, Social Sciences, Public Administration, Project Management, Education) or a related field.
- At least 3 years of working experience in coordinating, organizing activities and events.
- Field-Based Experience in Data collection and reporting.
- Proficient in standard office software (Word, Excel, PowerPoint).
- Ability to manage multiple tasks simultaneously.
- Knowledge on disaster risk management is an asset.
- Proven experience to work independently and collaboratively within a team in the selected region (i.e Shkodra or Fieri).
- Availability to travel in the project area.
